Leadership Highlights

The leadership highlights for September 2026 in the Clearview School Division emphasize a comprehensive approach to staff and educational development. Key activities included a Leadership Learning Team (LLT) session focused on inclusion and strategic planning for the year ahead. On August 28, a professional development day centered on inclusive education featured Dr. Shawn Reynolds, highlighting the division's commitment to fostering a learning environment focused on meeting the needs of every child. Additionally, comprehensive site visits were made to all schools, ensuring leadership presence and support across the division. The period also saw intensive planning for upcoming professional development in numeracy and literacy, with sessions scheduled through November, demonstrating a proactive stance in educational excellence and staff engagement.

Dual Credit Enhancement Grant

Clearview School Division has been awarded a \$100,000 Dual Credit Enhancement Grant for the 2024/25 school year. This funding, secured through the efforts of Deputy Superintendent Daram Van Oers, will enhance the Welder Apprenticeship program through the purchase of new equipment. The School Finance department will release the funds in early October 2024, and Clearview will manage these funds, submitting a final report by July 31, 2025, as outlined by the Alberta Dual Credit framework.

Strategic Outcomes and Educational Insights

The Board of Trustees of Clearview School Division will be attending the following forums this fall: the Alberta Rural Caucus and the Alberta School Boards Association Fall General Meeting.

Information Reports included a comprehensive overview with school council annual reports and preliminary enrollment data that provided insights into community engagement and demographic shifts. Discussions also focused on the Alberta Education School Construction Accelerator Program, which was announced by the Government of Alberta September 18, 2024.

Communication and Engagement efforts centered on improving interactions with school councils, highlighted by a dedicated engagement roundtable to strengthen community relationships. Plans for the forthcoming Policy and Communications Committee meetings in November were also detailed, which were critical for refining policies that directly impact student experiences and ensuring that community feedback is effectively integrated into decision-making processes.

Preliminary Enrolment Estimates 2024-25

The preliminary enrollment estimates for the 2024-2025 academic year in Clearview School Division show a total enrollment of 2,333 students across various grades, including colony schools. This represents a slight decrease from the previous year's total of 2,349 students. The estimates reflect a dynamic demographic trend within the division, with certain schools experiencing slight declines, while others see stable or slightly increased numbers. These enrollment figures are critical for planning and resource allocation, ensuring that the division can effectively meet educational needs and maintain high standards of instruction and support for all students.
